

Rules for the Republican Party of Outagamie County Annual County Caucus 2020

1. Outagamie County Republican Party members in good standing shall be eligible to vote. (Good standing is all members that have paid memberships on or before December 31, 2018 **and** resident in Outagamie County.)
2. All votes shall be by voice, unless a motion is made for a show of hands showing credential slip, a standing vote, or a written secret ballot.
3. All resolutions shall be in writing; whether from the Resolutions Committee or the Floor, before they are considered.
4. Floor resolutions must have 30 copies and be seconded by two individuals (with their signatures) other than the member who introduced the resolution. A member may introduce a maximum of three (3) resolutions from the floor.
5. To speak, a caucus participant must be recognized by the Caucus Chair.
6. No member shall speak more than twice upon the same question or longer than three minutes, unless they are explaining their own resolution. If so, then they will speak no longer than the Caucus Chair deems appropriate.
7. Robert's Rules of Order (Newly Revised) shall govern this Caucus; insofar as they are applicable and not in conflict with the rules of the Caucus as adopted and the Constitution of the Republican Party of Outagamie County and the Constitution of the State of Wisconsin.
8. The Caucus Chair shall appoint a Parliamentarian for the caucus. The Parliamentarian shall give advice to the Caucus Chair on all decisions regarding any procedural questions.
